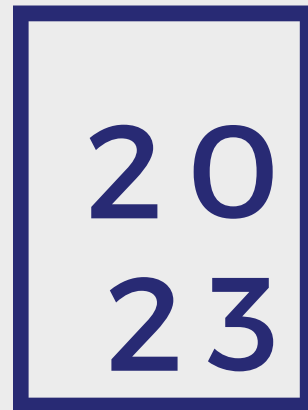

# HOW WE WORK



## AGING

Our Older Adult and Adult Day Care Centers offer supervised daytime care with nutritious meals and social activities to support motor and cognitive skills. We have classes like smartphone basics, autobiography, and dance. Locations in Manhattan, Flushing, and Corona, with home-delivered meals in Bayside and Astoria.



## EDUCATION

Our Education department offers ESOL classes to help non-native speakers improve literacy, Korean language classes, and free naturalization test prep. Asian American high school and college students can gain public service experience through NYC internships with our YASP program.
